#### **RIVER SAFETY**



Make sure you have proper fitting life jackets for everyone on your trip. It is especially smart to have younger children wearing PFDs at all times when in the water.



Drink plenty of water before getting on the water, even starting the night before if you to bring extra bottles of water and drink plenty throughout the day.



Make sure to check the weather before heading out. If a storm is likely, consider planning a shorter plan to be out all day. Make sure trip. If you see lightning while on the river, exit the water immediately.



Use plenty of sunblock, even on cloudy days. Sunglasses also protect your eyes from the sun hitting off the water.



Check the water levels before going out. Heavy rains earlier in the week could still have the river too high and unsafe for boating and swimming.



When going on the river, try not to go alone. At the very least, let someone know when you're going, where you're going and when you plan on returning.



**Nicholas Cresswell** 1750-1804

Born in England, Nicholas Cresswell came to America to make his fortune in farming. He kept a journal of his adventures, including his time on the Youghiogheny. Stephenson's. This Gentleman is a great Indian Warrior, but appears to be a good-natured man.

Thursday, April 13th, 1775. Captn. Stephenson advises me to build our canoe here, provisions are cheaper than at Fort Pitt. Rice professes to be a Carpenter and understands the building of them, is acquainted here and will fortnight.

Friday, April 14th, 1775. This morning, Rice and another man Canoe.

**Wednesday, April 12th, 1775**. Went **Sunday, April 16, 1775** After dinner got a man with Captn. Douglas to Captn. John to conduct us to the place where General Braddock was defeated by the French and Indians the 9th. July 1755. It is on the Banks of the Mon-in-ga-ha-ly River. Found great numbers of bones, both men and horses. The trees are injured, I suppose by the Artillery. It appears to me the front of our Army never extended more than 300 yards and the greatest slaughter seems to have been made within 400 yards of the River, where it is level and full of underwood. Farther from the River it is hilly and some rocks where the enemy undertake to have one finished in a would still have the advantage of the ground. We could not find one whole skull, all of them broke to pieces in the upper part, some of them had holes broken in them about an inch diameter, suppose it to be done with a Pipe begun to cut down a tree to make a Tomahawk. I am told the wounded were all massacred by the Indians.

Yaughagany River, Virginia-Friday, April **28th, 1775**. Left part of my clothes with Mr. Crawford till my return. Parted with Captn. Douglas by whom I returned the Horse. Launched our Canoes. One of them we called the Charming Sally, the other Charming Polly. They are 30 foot long and about 20 inches wide, made of Walnut trees, dug out something like a manger. Proceeded down the Yaughagany River.




**GOOD VIBES** 

(Cressewll cont.) Obliged to get Pilots to carry the Canoes down the Falls, very bad navigation. Full of dangerous rapids. Camped at Washington's Bottom, expect over the shoals for two miles the rest of the company to join us in the morning. I may now bid adieu to sleeping in beds or houses for some months.

#### Saturday, April 29, 1775

Proceeded down the River to the mouth of Saweekly Creek. The navigation very bad. Obliged to push the Canoes together. A great number of rapids, is a very dangerous navigation. Mr. Nourse insists on me taking one half of his tent; this is very agreeable.



Yaughagany River, Virginia-Monday, May 1st, 1775. After down the River. Crossed several Fish pots. These fish pots are made by throwing up the small stones and gravel something like a the River and proceeding in a diagonal line, till they meet in the middle of the stream, where they fix a thing like the body of a cart, contracted where the water flows in just to admit the fish, but, so return or escape. Got over the into the Monin-ga-ha-ley about noon. Eat our dinner at Magee's Fort.


